Weekly Services

Zoom—These meetings offer a chance to catch up with staff and pupils. Zooms will continue for P4-P7 pupils and catch-up session will be offered to anyone who are forced to remain at home due to isolate at home due to isolation or illness.

My School & TEAMS (P4-P7) — Work and activities are uploaded regularly here for Homebased Learning.

Ballyhenry App—Available free from Google Play and App Store, get updates and reminders from school and submit homework for feedback via the app.

Email Contact—Email your child's class teacher with questions or to submit work. Your child's teacher will reply.

Paper Packs—Packs have been prepared for every child in P4-P7. They can be collected on Fridays 2:30 to 3:30 and Mondays 7:45 to 8:15 & 9:30 to 10:15. You can drop off the work your child has completed to be marked. A courtesy phone call will be made if you haven't collected your child's pack. This is to support you in case you need us to drop it off to you because your family is isolating or needs help.

Face-to-Face Supervise Learning—School is open to support the pupils of Key Workers and vulnerable pupils. Emails are being sent directly to these families. Dates for your Diary

- Face-to-Face Learning for P1 to P3 pupils on Monday 8th March. When face-to-face learning resumes, we will continue with all established protocols including:
 - staggered starts/end
 - class bubbles
 - social distancing of adults
 - mask to be worn by all adults in common areas.

- Parents/carers should adhere to social distancing and wear a mask when dropping off and collecting their child from school.
- School will be closed on Wednesday 17th March. There will be no face-to-face, supervised or remote learning on this date.
- The current plan is that P1 to P3 pupils will resume homebased learning on Monday 22nd March. However, this arrangement is under review and may change.
- School will be closed from Monday 28th March to Monday 12th April (inclusive).
- Face-to-Face learning will continue for P1 to P3 pupils on Tuesday 13th April. We are waiting for guidance from the government relating to the return to school for P4 to P7 pupils.

Nut Free School



We have recently been informed of two children (in P2 & P6) who have a severe food allergy to peanuts and nuts. It is important the there is a strict avoidance to these feeds in order to prevent a life-threatening allergic reaction. We are asking for your help to provide al all our pupils with a safe school environment. P4-P7 Pupils

The government has determined that schools should reopen for P1-P3 pupils. However, P4-P7 children CANNOT attend school. For these children we will continue to upload learning links to Microsoft TEAMS and work will be provided on a weekly basis. Parents/carers will be able to collect paper packs to support learning. It will continue to be possible to return work digitally via the app and on paper. Engagement is essential as this is how attendance marks are allocated. - Online learning will continue for all P4-P7 Pupils
- P4 to P7 will use the platform Microsoft Teams as their platform for learning.
- Paper packs are available for all P4-P7 pupils. If a younger sibling is in school, we will send home the work with them and they can bring work back to school to be marked.
- Supervised learning is available but must be booked by 9:00 p.m. on Sunday evening.

Microsoft TEAMS—

P5 to P7 Pupils have moved to TEAMS as their main method of accessing online resources for learning. P4 pupils are joining them on this platform. TEAMS gives a little more flexibility in terms of the exchange of information among pupils and staff. Like on Fronter, teachers will be able to upload videos, PowerPoints and resources that will support the children's learning. New to the children (and parents/carers) is the ability to respond (via chat) to the resources provided. They will also be able to work collaboratively on projects and enhance their learning. Staff can monitor engagement and help wherever needed. Your child has been added to their class TEAM via their C2K Address (username 123@c2ken.net). They can log into Teams using their username and password.



Zoom Learning

The teachers are doing some formal teaching sessions through zoom. Children should bring their whiteboard and pen to each session. If you haven't had a chance to join in, why not give it a go? Simply download Zoom on any device and enter the Meeting ID Number followed by the Passcode. You will then be admitted to the waiting room. If your child is a little nervous keep the camera off and let them listen and participate with you. You can see more of the class at one time by choosing "gallery view" (click in the upper right corner). The schedule will be updated so your times may change slightly.

Supervised Learning for P4-P7

Northern Ireland is currently in a Lockdown. We have been directed to "Stay at Home". We will endeavor to offer limited supervised learning from 8:45 am to 3 pm. Children in school engaging in supervised learning who have a younger sibling in school will go home with them at 2:00. This provision is for those children whose parents have exhausted ALL other options for their child's care.

THIS IS EMERGENCY PROVISION. GIVEN THE HIGH RATES OF TRANSMISSION, THE NEW VARIENT OF THE VIRUS AND GOVERNMENT GUIDANCE YOUR CHILD IS SAFER AT HOME. BOOKING IS ESSENTIAL AND CHILDREN WHO HAVE NOT BOOKED WILL BE SENT HOME.

Schools have been told not to operate Breakfast Clubs or B 'Happy. If you need additional support, please request it via the comment box.

Booking supervised learning is essential. If your child has not booked in, they will not be allowed to attend. If a child arrives for Supervised Learning and their place has not been secured, they will wait outside the office while we contact a parent/carer to come and collect them. <u>http://bit.ly/face2face21</u>

Attendance

The Department of Education requires schools to mark attendance even when children are learning from home. P1-P3 are expected to be in school while P4-P7 are learning to be learning at home. The decision to mark a child present and learning at home is determined by their level of engagement. For us, this means answering these questions:

• Attendance in school for P1-P3 pupils

- Is your child's paper pack being collect and/or are they regularly on Fronter? Remember if you can't come to school, we will arrange for someone to drop it off and collect your child's work to be mark.
- Is work being returned for marking either online or through our drop off system?
- Has your child engaged in any Zoom Sessions?
- Have you contributed to Facebook?
- Has there been any telephone/email contact?
- Is your child enrolled in face-to-face supervised learning?

There are a lot of options here and we don't expect everyone to do everything. Instead, we are providing lots of choice so that you can choose what is best for your child and your family. Homebased learning is challenging, and we must work together. We just need a little bit of evidence that you and your child are doing your best to engage and do a little bit of work. Unfortunately, we are also being told that we still must contact the Education Welfare Service if a child is below 85%. We really need your help to ensure that their support is not necessary. Letters will be sent out this week to pupils for which there is an attendance concern.
